Maintenance Sources of Repair



Challenges

➤ *Funding Now*

- Retrograde
- Repair Parts to Include Long Lead Time Parts
- Inductions for Assets on the Ground

➤ *DA Unit of Action Prioritization*

➤ *Existing Business Rules (e.g. carryover)*

➤ *Continue to support current Operations Without Interruption*
