Reset Defined – DOD Definition

RESET:

Actions taken to return units to a desired level of combat capability commensurate with the unit's future mission.

- Includes: Maintenance and supply activities that **restore** and **enhance** combat capability.
- Accomplished by: **repair, rebuild, or procurement.**
- Involving: Depot (Sustainment) and Field Level (e.g. organizational or intermediate) repairs/overhauls.
- Including: Procurement, RDT&E, and Operations and Maintenance to enhance existing equipment.

- Organic USMC Depot Capacity Expands to Maximum Surge Capacity
- Planning – Timing of the Requirements
- Training
 - Facilities and Equipment
- Planning for the Future



Condition of Equipment

- Harsh Environment (Heat, Sand and Dust)
- Operational Requirements
- Equipment Usage Rates
- Equipment Modifications
- Latency



Mitigation of Risks

- Continue Working with HQMC to Insert Supplemental Funding Into the Baseline
- Continued Process Improvements
- Effective use of Contractor Labor
- Continuous Coordination with State/Local Institutions to Train Workforce in Needed Skills
 - Welding, Environmental Specialists, Engineers
