


# **Background**

- Over the period 1998 to 2008, DoD organic and commercial depot maintenance costs grew by 122% in nominal terms and by 62% in real terms.
- Most of this cost growth occurred during the first five-year period as the draw-down from the Cold War ended and the ramp-up for the Global War on Terror began.
