Green Initiatives

- Meeting rooms with natural light and Executive floor lounge with 180 degree windows saves energy involved with lighting
- TTC accessible by streetcar, subway, walking (from Union station); 90% of hotel staff use TTC or walk to work
- Pens made entirely from recycled materials in all of our meeting rooms
- Blue bins in every guestroom and all functional team member offices
- Leftover food from food and beverage outlets and banquets is distributed to the needy through Second Harvest food bank in an annual value of \$85,000
- Double-sided printing practices are in place in hotel departments
- Lobby lights are dimmed in the evenings and candles are used to reduce electricity usage
- Coffee mugs used in meeting rooms as opposed to Styrofoam
- Water pitchers offered in meeting rooms to reduce plastic bottle consumption
- Saving energy by having installed variable speed drives in engineering for most of the motors and pumps which reduces the speed of the motors when the loads are reduced
- Having an HVAC building automation system in place conserves energy
- Motion sensors are used in many areas to save electricity when lights do not need to be on
- Changed lighting to energy efficient lamps wherever possible
- A towel recycling program is communicated to guests to encourage their partnership in reducing the water and electricity consumption associated with laundering
- Old towels, sheets, and napkins are recycled as rags
- Paper that is typically thrown in the recycling bin is re-used as scrap paper first before it is recycled
- Old inventory is offered to team members or sold to liquidators (i.e. lamps, curtains, chairs, etc.)
- Supplier relations- The majority of Housekeeping inventory is shipped to the hotel in recyclable cardboard boxes
